Classes Offered

Essentials of Fire Chaplaincy-

The Basic Fire Chaplain training includes 16 hours of course material designed as survey of ministry in the fire service. During basic training the chaplain will learn about Ministry to Firefighters, Ministry to Fire Victims, Critical Incident Stress, Fire Department Funerals, Fire Chaplain Operations, and many others. Assisting Individuals in Crisis- This program is designed for teach participants the fundamentals of, and a specific protocol for, individual crisis intervention. This course is designed for anyone who desires to increase their knowledge of individual (one-on-one) crisis intervention techniques in the fields of Business & Industry, Crisis Intervention, Disaster Response, Education, Emergency Services, Employee Assistance, Healthcare, Homeland Security, Mental Health, Military, Spiritual Care, and Traumatic Stress. This is an ICISF accredited course.

Fire Chaplains Toolbox - This option will include three shorter trainings as well as time for open discussion, and sharing of experiences. The three trainings are-

- **Death Notification** This course gives the student twenty-four suggested steps to follow in a death notification. It describes each one in detail including the preparation phase, the delivery phase and the follow-up ministry. It also covers other topics including Children and Death, the Deceased and the Dead Body, Embalming, Cremation and Funerals: understanding Grief and Loss and Self Care for the Death Notifier.

- Ministry in a Pluralistic Society- This course will cover the five major religions of the world Hinduism, Buddhism, Judaism, Islam and Christianity. We will talk about the basic tenants of faith for each of them AND some of the subdivisions of these major faith traditions. We will give special attention to the Muslim faith and the rise of "radical Islam" and how it is impacting world. Instructed by Robby Jernigan
- Stress Management and Resiliency- This course will emphasize effective ways of dealing with stress. This will be done with an emphasis on self care for the caregiver. It will also give you information that you could use in presenting a similar training for your firefighters.

- Improving Personal Ethics in the Fire Service- The purpose of this class is to improve the participant's knowledge and awareness of ethics in general.
