The purpose of this course from the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF) is to enhance the skills of *experienced* chaplains, first responders, clergy, and mental health professionals to provide effective emotional and spiritual care people within disaster operations. THIS WHOLE COURSE IS BEING REVISED, AND YOU'LL BE AMONG THE FIRST PEOPLE IN THE WORLD TO BE TRAINED IN THE NEW MATERIAL! By the end of the seminar you'll be able to:

- Articulate the role of the emotional and spiritual caregiver from your own faith tradition, as well as the caregiver's role in a pluralistic disaster environment.
- Clearly define the role and function of the emotional and spiritual caregiver within the Incident Command System, National Incident Management System, and disaster relief operation.
- Identify the physical, psychological, emotional, behavioral, interpersonal and spiritual impact of disasters.
- Outline key research relating to resilience and building personal hardiness to facilitate post-disaster recovery and growth.
- Develop an emotional and spiritual care plan to provide appropriate and effective help for disaster survivors, first responders and relief workers.
- Assess your own suitability to provide emotional and spiritual care within a trauma and disaster context.
- Identify a self-care plan for maintaining your own emotional and spiritual health during deployment.

Completion of this seminar (all 14 hours) qualifies as a course in the ICISF Certificate of Specialized Training Program, as advanced training in the Federation of Fire Chaplains and International Conference of Police Chaplains, and may qualify toward credentialing in the Pennsylvania Disaster Spiritual Care Network. COST

The class costs \$160. This includes two days of instruction and discussion, workbook, a certificate of completion from the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation, and donuts & coffee plus lunch and snacks on both days. Classes will be held on the upper floor of Hermitage Fire Department's station 3 on the corner of Mercer Avenue and Maple Drive (just a few miles north of Interstate 80 exit 4B). Parking is in the lot to the right of the station. Classes are 8:30 am to 4:30 pm both days. Registration is Monday at 8 am. Dress is casual.
